 Teachers can set up student "group leaders" and assign them certain tutor rights in class, allowing them to lead and demonstrate to their peers.

Influence and Innovation

- Create approved website lists you can customise, to positively influence behaviour.
- Give individual students visual rewards to encourage effort and good behaviour.

- Create and share tests and surveys in a variety of formats to reinforce learning outcomes.

- Capture class content in a journal for post-lesson review. This is handy for revision and particularly beneficial for students absent from a lesson.

Respect and Responsibility
